New Retail Development Should Provide Living Wages and Benefits

Baltimore residents agree: We have standards. We won't invite just anyone into our neighborhoods, but only those companies who are good corporate neighbors.

Residents say new supercenters like Walmart aren't welcome unless they live up to local standards.

This means new stores must:

- Pay a minimum wage of \$12 an hour
- Designate at least 75% of jobs as full-time positions
- Commit to recruiting and hiring workers from the local community
- Reinvest a portion of the local tax breaks they receive to charities and community organizations in the surrounding neighborhoods

We want jobs, but we want them to be good jobs.
